
## Working Patterns Useful in Nursery

(For either filet crochet or cross-stitch)

The basket cross-stitched in a gray, with pink center flowers, blue flowers to sides and delicate green leaves, with baby-blue bow on handle, makes a lovely center design for a buggy robe, worked over canvas 8 squares to the inch, with 6 strands of embroidery floss. It is also useful for the center medallion of a child's bedspread, in filet crochet, if the bow knots pattern below is made for the side, top and bottom medallions.

The medallion marked "Baby" is useful, crocheted in 80 thread, and put on a wide ribbon, width of medallion, and drawn at top for a baby hot water bag. Also pretty cross-stitched in blue letters, with pink flowers and green leaves.

The violets should be cross-



stitched in lavenders with green leaves and stems, on a towel, at either side of initials, or on a sachet bag, filled with violet powder.

The little basket is dainty for a baby towel, with a gray bas-ket and delicate rose flowers fill-

ing it.
The stiff little medallion in center of page makes an attractive pattern for the baby's pincushion, either in filet or cross stitch. The geese will make lovely borders for the curtains, and can easily be made the right length to fit width of material by adding closed meshes at either end and between the groups of geese in the center. This is also true if they are cross-stitched on unbleached curtains in yellow, or any one tone, to match the nursery.
