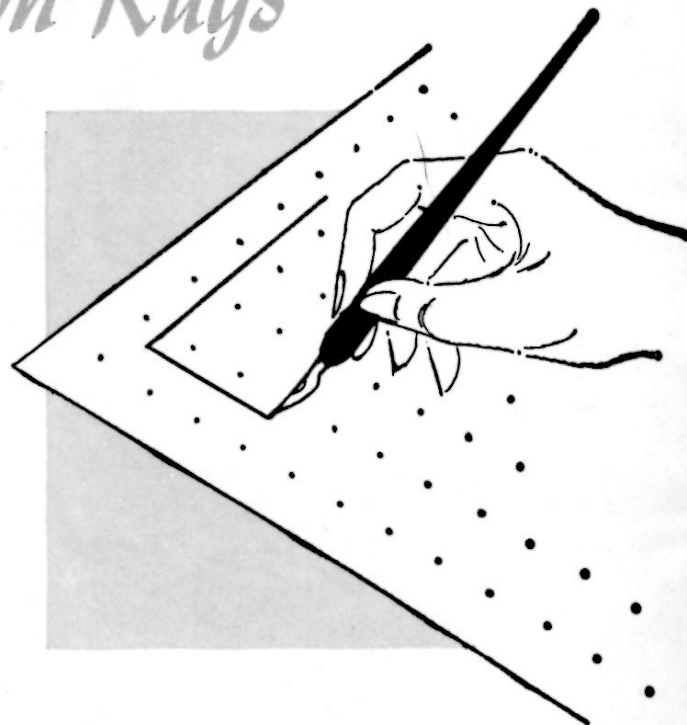


Pom Pon Rugs

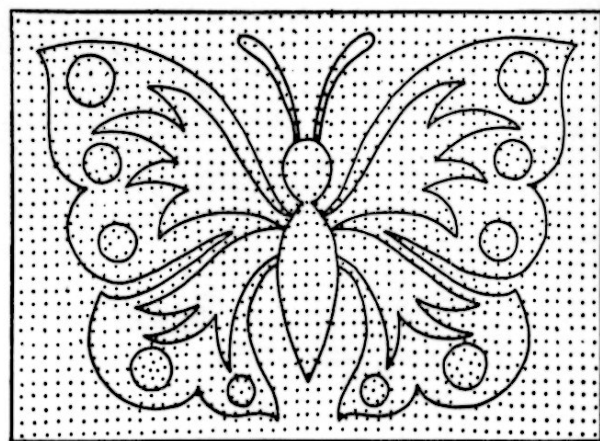
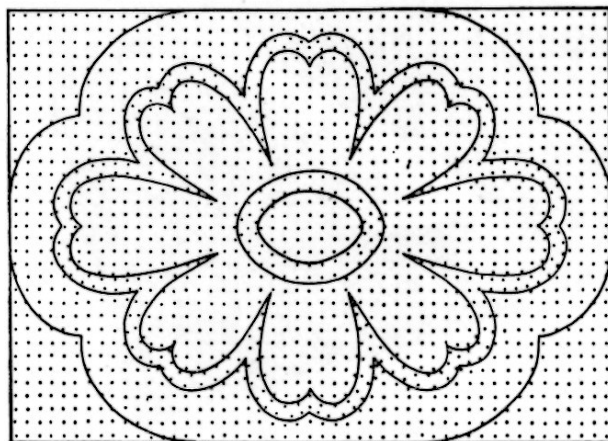
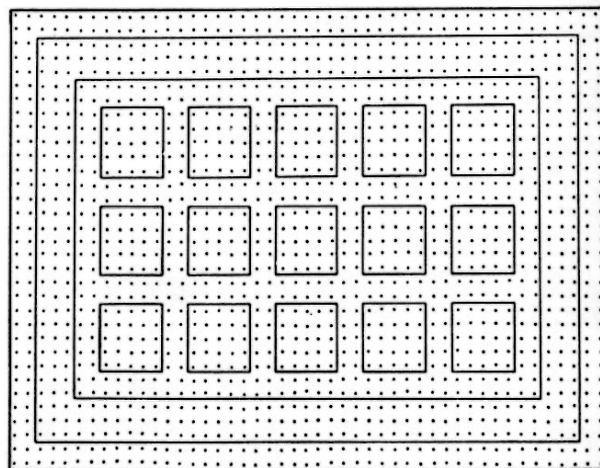
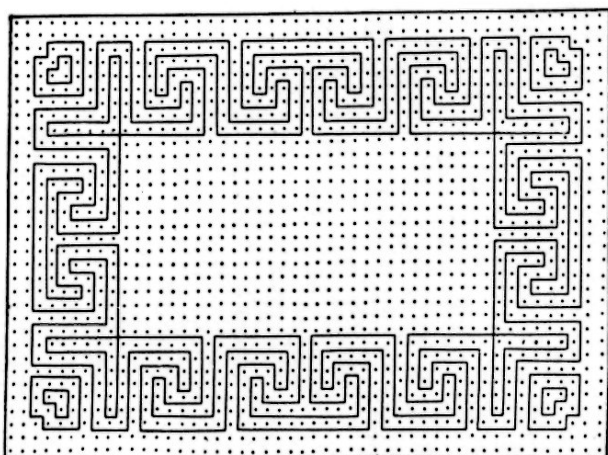
Pompon rugs are simple to make and lush to walk upon — and can be very individual.

Select a piece of burlap or warp cloth . . . the size you want . . . and with a heavy marking pen mark it off in a series of dots 1 inch apart.

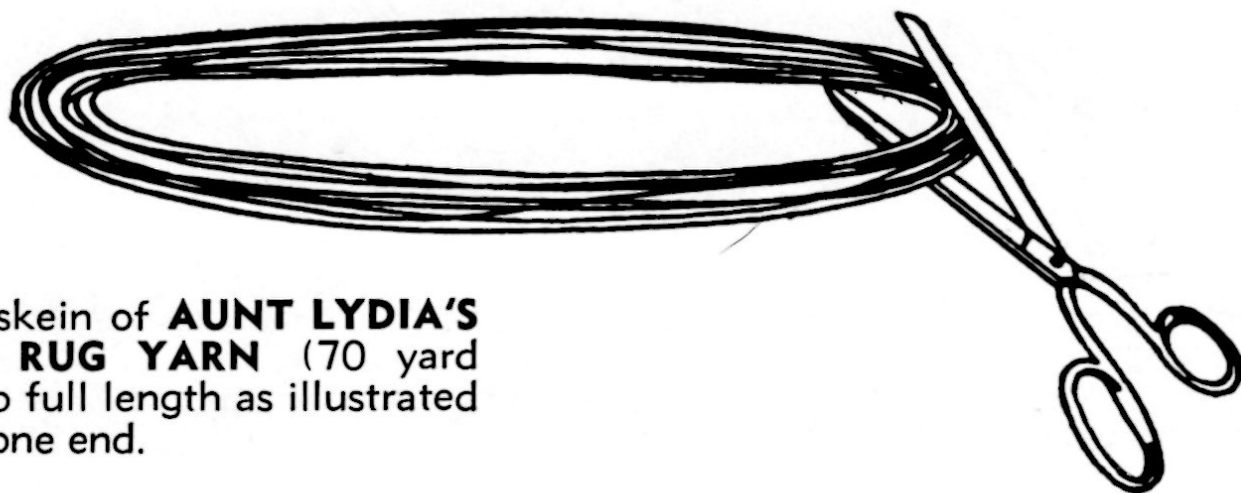
Then make a simple drawing of your own over the dots. Below are some designs that might be idea givers. You don't need a frame to make Pompon rugs.



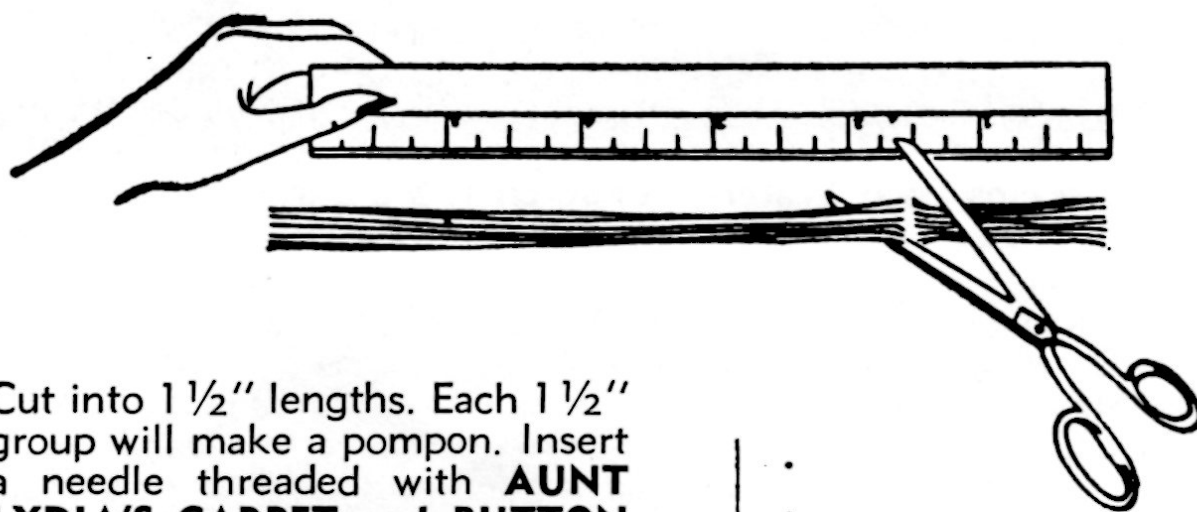
DESIGNS YOU CAN MAKE



How to Make Pom Pon Rugs



Open a skein of **AUNT LYDIA'S HEAVY RUG YARN** (70 yard skein) to full length as illustrated and cut one end.



Cut into $1\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths. Each $1\frac{1}{2}$ " group will make a pompon. Insert a needle threaded with **AUNT LYDIA'S CARPET and BUTTON THREAD** in one of the dots near the center of the foundation, fasten firmly. Place a pompon over the thread and sew center of the pompon to the foundation securely using two or three stitches. Finish rug — hemming same as punch needle rugs.
