



A Tea Apron of Yellow and Black

MATERIALS REQUIRED: 6 skeins of The American Thread Company's "Silkine" Art Thread, Article 50, one skein each of the following shades: 1072, 1074, 1112, 1006, 1013 and 1151; $\frac{3}{4}$ yd. of 36 in. material, $2\frac{1}{4}$ yds. lace and $1\frac{1}{4}$ yds. ribbon. Pale yellow voile and black lace were used for this little apron.

Flowers: Using the full six strands, wind cotton around finger 24 times, slip off the finger, work over threads two or three times and fasten with a needle and thread. Make two flowers with shade No. 1074, one of shade No. 1072 and two with shade No. 1112. Arrange in position according to large illustration and couch down with black. Three yellow French knots in each center finish the flowers. The leaves are made of five or six loops tacked at the top and base of leaf with the same shade and finished with tiny running stitches through the center. When complete the apron is 23 inches long and 27 inches wide shaped at the bottom as illustrated. Make a three-inch hem at the top and shir sides to shape. The straight lines in the body of apron and the center of the belt are worked in small running stitches using two strands of black. Finish with lace and ties.
