GOLF MITTS



MATERIALS: BEAR BRAND, FLEISHER'S or BOTANY
Machine Washable TWIN-PAK
WIN-KNIT , 4 oz paks....

For 4 Mitts—Color A . . . 1 pak

For Embroidery—Color B . . . about 15 yards

"BOYE" or "DIANA" NEEDLES: Size 6—
Crochet Hook, Size F

OR SIZE YOU REQUIRE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

GAUGE: Stockinette St—5 sts = 1 inch 7 rows = 1 inch

With A, cast on 44 sts. Work k 2, p 2 ribbing for 3 ins.

First Dec. Row—right side—* K 2, p 2 tog.; repeat from * to end; 33 sts.

Next Row—* K 1, p 2; repeat from * to end.

Next Row—* K 2, p 1; repeat from * to end.

Repeat these 2 rows 4 times.

Inc. Row—wrong side—Inc. 1 st in first st, p 2, * inc. 1 st in next st, p 2; repeat from * to end; 44 sts. Work k 2, p 2 ribbing for 6 rows. K 1 row and continue St. st until 20 rows above ribbing, end on wrong side. Work k 2, p 2 ribbing for 6 rows.

Top Shaping—Repeat first dec. row; 33 sts. P 1 row.

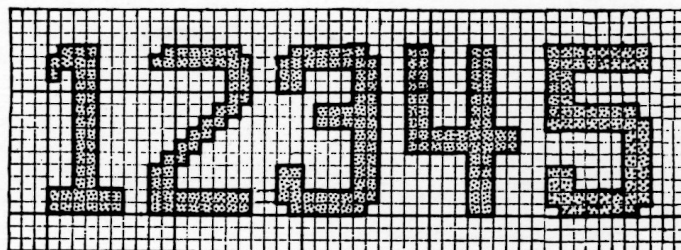
2nd Dec. Row—K 2 tog. 16 times, k 1; 17 sts. P 1 row.

3rd Dec. Row—K 2 tog. 8 times, k 1. Break yarn, leave 24-in. end.

Run end through 9 sts. Insert hook in last st and draw up a loop, drawing yarn up tight, ch 8; join with a slip st in 5th st of last k row. Ch 1, turn, slip st in each ch. Fasten off and run yarn through 9 sts of last k row again. Make 4 mitts. With 2 strands of B, embroider desired numeral in duplicate st, see page 59, at center of St. st section of each mitt as shown on chart below.

Cord—With 2 strands of A, ch 15 ins. Fasten off.

FINISHING—Block, see page 3. Sew seam, matching pat. Run ends of cord through loops at top of 2nd and 3rd mitt, tie knots with 4½ ins. at center of cord between mitts. Knot first and 4th mitts in numerical order at ends of cord; sew knots securely.

COMPLETE ABBREVIATIONS

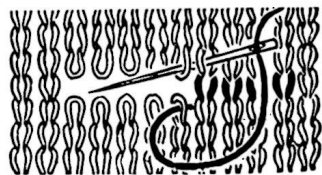
K—knit	tog.—together	dec.—decrease(s)(d)(ing)	pat.(s.)—pattern(s)
P—purl	sl—slip	inc.—increase(s)(d)(ing)	in.(s.)—inch(es)
st(s)—stitch(es)	St. st—stockinette st	beg.—beginning	SC—single crochet

sl st—slip stitch—pass st from one needle to another without working it. Unless otherwise specified, always sl st as to P, **except** when dec.—as in SKP—, then sl as to K.

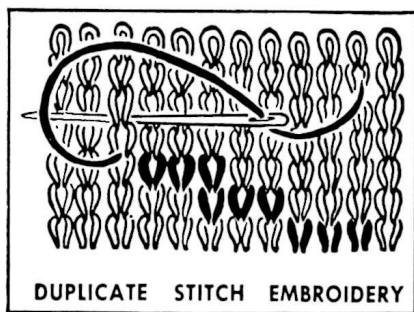
SKP—sl, K and pass—sl 1, K 1, pass the sl st over the K st.

An asterisk (*) indicates that the instructions immediately following are to be repeated the given number of times in addition to the original.

Double Star (**) and Dagger (†) are used in the same way.



WEAVING STOCKINETTE STITCH—Thread a tapestry needle and bring pieces to be joined close together. Draw up yarn in first st on upper piece, inserting needle from wrong side; insert needle from right side in first st on lower piece and bring up through next st from wrong side—draw up yarn; * insert needle from right side in same st as before on upper piece and bring up through next st from wrong side—draw up yarn; insert needle from right side in same st as before on lower piece and bring up through next st—draw up yarn; repeat from * until all sts are joined, and fasten yarn well before breaking off.



Note: Be sure to buy sufficient yarn of each color *in the same dye lot number* to complete the article.
